Child :Yeong Tung Hao (born in year 1998)

My boy, Hao, year 4 student, was diagnosed as autism at 6 years old. Since 2 1/2 years old, he made sound but could not talk, so I searched 'high and low' for answer. He had little eye contact, not communication and no socialization. He was at his own world all the time – played ball by himself, kept repeating the song and dialogue from the children CD. He had the typical autism syndrome.

He attended early intervention program, physio-therapy, speech therapy...and myself looked into reference books, internet, articles, etc to find ways to interact with him. Going through all these efforts for 5 years, I was not satisfy with the outcome. I felt that some kind of 'booster' is needed to spur the progress.

By chance, through a close friend, I get to know VE Sensory at June 2006. After a chat with the principal, Ms. Tan, my instinct tell me I have found the 'booster'. Though I am aware Autism in medical field has yet to find cure, but any natural method that can minimized the defects is already a blessing. So my decision to join the training is very determine. I packed from my hometown, Kuching, and brought Hao to VE Sensory Subang branch for the training.

After 1 year of intensive training, Hao's eye contact improved, for example, he can look at people and be able to greet people. He became aware of the environment, for example, he can make comment 'who is coming?' when he heard someone knocked at the door; his speech improved significantly, for example, he is able to demand for his need by speech instead of gesture. His stubbornness is also reduced as he is able to listen and understand the message and able to accept the change to certain extend. He also becomes more settle. Now he is able to sit in the class for longer time instead of running in and out of the class all the time. With the training, Hao is able to absorb and digest the information better. I am very excited with his progress and there are rooms for greater improvement. This sensory exercise has now become part of Hao daily activity.

My girl, Ying, year 2 student, had been a ‘hard to be pleased’ child since baby time. She could cry out for no reason (as we didn’t understand then) at any time or places. Her emotion swings unpredictably.

When she was a baby, she did not like to be touched by people except myself and the babysitter. She ate slow and choosy on food. Her speech development was slow. At kindy age, she cried to school everyday. Her behavior became very annoying too. She would screamed out loud, banged on the table or stumbled her foot to slow her anger; she made faces to show her displeased feeling. She shut off herself easily. Her performance at school was almost blank. She was stubborn and emotional, so her absorption of information was limited. I punished her by spanning, isolating, and desperately screaming at her in order to correct her bad behavior. However, all my efforts did not get any better result but get worst instead.

I enrolled her into the VE Sensory training after her brother’s second months training. After the first three months, her emotion and behavior showed a significant change positively. Her temper was calmer, less screaming, and more smiles on the face. She could tolerate with things that she touched; for example, she could play with the splashy rainwater instead of screaming when the water hit on her. Progressively, her ability to absorb information improved significantly. It seems like the locked up intelligence has out poured from her body. Now she is able to recognize more words and easier to be taught as she is not so stubborn and not shutting off easily. Though she still has her temper, but she can control better and her bad temper is minimized. Her speech also improved, for example, her pronunciation is clearer and able to communicate better. She is a cheerful child now.

By interacting with VE, I get to understand my child better. As a parent or even as a person, it is a good experience to go through the process of becoming more sensitive and understanding to the people we love and care. I deeply feel awful for all the punishments I have done to my child. So, parents, do not get fooled by our child’s rebellious, annoying and disguising appearance behaviors, they are not trying to challenge us (as what we like to assume); they are actually screaming for our help. Do act wisely, smartly and sensitively to lend our helping hand.
